A. COURSE DESCRIPTION

This class focuses on the heart of Photoshop Elements Editing - Layers. Layers, the equivalent of transparent overlays, provide a means of having items added to or subtracted from an image. Objects created in a layer can be moved, rotated, enlarged or reduced relative to other layers. Students will learn about the palette bin, how layer(s) can be manipulated to create a photographic montage and how to add text.

B. METHOD OF INSTRUCTION

Lecture, discussion, question and answer, demonstration, hands-on computer use related to the course and student demonstration of course related tasks.

C. COURSE OBJECTIVES

Objective 1: Students will successfully demonstrate adding and subtracting items to an image.

Objective 2: Students will successfully demonstrate moving, rotating, enlarging and reducing objects created in a layer.

Objective 3: Students will successfully demonstrate knowledge about the palette bin and successfully demonstrate manipulation of layers.

Objective 4: Students will successfully create a photographic montage and successfully add text to it.
