Course Description:

This class will use the free Video Editing Software – Windows Live Movie Maker – for those who have Vista or Windows 7 Operating Systems and who want to learn video editing without spending a lot of money on a Video Editing Software. This one is FREE. Students will learn how to cut unwanted clips from a video, organize their clips, add still photos, and adjust photos and animations. Students should be able to video with their camera and bring a couple of short video clips, a few still photos and use them for this class. You may also bring your own laptop. This class is for those who love inexpensive fun and ease with video editing and who want to take their photography a step further!

Method of Instruction: This course uses mainly hands-on computer instruction; see how it is done, do it yourself! Lecture, demonstration, discussion, Q&A as related to the course material; students will demo course related tasks.

Course Objectives:

Objective 1: Students will learn how to download video to this software.

Objective 2: Students will successfully demonstrate how to clip unwanted video from an existing video clip. They will learn how to adjust the sound on the clip, add music, still photos and animation to their video.

Objective 3: Students will learn how to save their video in different formats, and will learn how to burn to a DVD for viewing their movie on a DVD or Blue Ray Player.

Note: This type of editing takes a lot of speed and power from your computer operating system. Older operating system (XP) does not have the capacity for this video editing. This class will have a limited number of students depending on Computer Availability with Vista/Win7
